Mary Conceived Without Sin

God needed a pure vessel to enter the world and so planned to use this special young girl named Mary. Yesterday, *Thursday, December 8th we remembered Mary's Immaculate Conception.* This is often misunderstood, the Immaculate Conception is when Mary was naturally conceived in her mother Anne's womb, but God kept her soul pure and free from sin. The celebration of the Immaculate Conception is a holy day of Obligation.

This liturgy of the Mass on this day celebrates that Mary was full of grace from the very beginning of her existence. This special grace prepared her to be the Mother of God. Because of the saving work of her Son, Mary was totally preserved from the stain of original sin all personal sin. Neither did Mary commit any sin throughout her entire life. Pope Pius IX proclaimed this infallible dogma in 1854. Mary is the patron saint of the United States. The Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate is located in Washington, D.C. The beautiful prayer we pray below is derived from the words Angel Gabriel said to Mary at the Annunciation and the words Elizabeth spoke to her at the Visitation ... at the end we ask our Blessed Mother to pray for us!




