The 4th Grade FIRST LEGO League (FLL) Robotics team, Wildcat Bots, wrapped up the season by competing at the Michigan State Championship on Sunday near Lansing. Our rookie team ranked #27 out of 48 teams. The majority of the teams in the competition are returning teams.

The Wildcat Bots met at the school multiple times a week throughout the season. They worked very hard for over 14 weeks. The kids learned a slew of skills including robot design and building, programming, strategizing, the engineering process, problem solving, teamwork, presenting, and even working under pressure. In addition, as part of the program, they designed, built, and shared a solution where solar panels are used to charge robots.

The season included participation in the Bishop Foley Qualifier Tournament in November where the team placed 6th out of 21 teams, won First Place in Robot Design Award, and advanced to the State Championship.

The Wildcat Bots are coached by Leonard Babajan and Gary Ruff (Gary is a Holy Family grandparent!) with mentors Stacey Ruff and Norbert Wroblewski.

Dear Parents,

As we approach the culmination of 2022 and head into 2023, our Finance Council has been diligently working on the financial budget for the 2023-2024 school year, along with the tuition rate schedule.

With operational costs on the rise, it continues to prove a difficult task to balance the budget while also staying true to our mission of making Catholic Education accessible and affordable to our community. It is crucial to note that the cost of education and operational costs at HFRS are not balanced simply through tuition income. Rather, it is a shared responsibility of competitive operational costs, affordable tuition rates, successful fundraising, and charitable donations.

As such, in our recent December meeting, The School Advisory Council reviewed and approved the ***new tuition schedule for the 2023-2024 school year.***

The following table outlines the current and new tuition rate schedule:

In summary, the In-Parish rate for 1 or 2 children has increased by \$400.00 per child, per year. The rate for additional children (In-Parish) has not changed and remains discounted. The cost for Out of Parish children has increased by \$500.00 per child, per year.

We are beyond thankful, and blessed, for the continual commitment of our parents and benefactors throughout the years. Whether through fundraising efforts or promotion of our Holy Family School; it allows us to continue our robust programs, maintain an outstanding faculty and staff, and continue offering affordable tuition and discounts to families with multiple enrolled children.

This is an exciting time at Holy Family as we continue to grow and develop as a family and community. We are a faith-filled community that is guided by the Holy Spirit and committed to following God's plan. Our faith in Jesus Christ, the education of our children, and our financial stability and perpetuity is a community obligation.

Your continued contribution of time, talents, and treasures provides both for today and into the future. On behalf of the School Advisory Council, the administration, faculty and staff, we extend to our families a heartfelt and sincere thank you for the countless blessings.

The Meaning of Christmas

The 12 days of Christmas are the 12 days that separate Christmas Day on December 25 and ends on January 5, with the next day being Epiphany, which is celebrated January 6. Depending on the church, January 6 may mark Christ's baptism (in the Catholic tradition), or it may mark the day that the wise men (or the Magi) visited Jesus with their gifts. The Day of Epiphany is when the church celebrates the revelation of Christ as the light of the world and recalls the journey of the Magi. Magi means wise men. From 1558 until 1829 Roman Catholics in England were not allowed to practice their faith openly. During that era someone wrote 'The Twelve Days of Christmas' as a kind of secret catechism that could be sung in public without risk of persecution. The song has two levels of interpretation: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the church. Each element in the carol is a code word for a religious reality. Some beliefs believe that the day after Christmas started the 12 Days of Christmas. You also hear some people think its the 12 days that lead up to Christmas. But really, it starts on December 25, that is the first day.

Religious and Spiritual Formation

- The elf has been visiting the first-grade classrooms each morning with a kindness note attached to him. Each day the children have been working on spreading kindness and holiday cheer to everyone they meet. The elf has encouraged the children to show kindness by telling someone why they are special to them, show kindness by giving three specific compliments, show kindness by letting someone go ahead of them in line or offering someone a seat at the rug.
- The seventh-grade students have been using Visio Divina with sacred artwork to reflect and write advent prayers. While reflecting on the Annunciation to Zachariah, one student wrote the following prayer:

Dear Jesus, this Advent please help me become more committed to the sacrifices I want to make this year. Help me find something to give up that will be worthy to your great sacrifice.

Academic Excellence

- The seventh graders took a cross curriculum field trip highlighting art and Spanish. They visited the Detroit Institute of Arts to see the Van Gogh in America exhibition. The students were very lucky to have this opportunity as it isn't a permanent exhibit. Students enjoyed seeing the Diego Rivera mural and exploring the museum. Following the DIA the students took a lunch break at an authentic Mexican restaurant in Mexican town. It was a true cultural art and Spanish experience in the heart of Detroit.



- In art class, Ms. Ervin's students in first through third grade worked together to make a vibrant piece of art for everyone to enjoy. The students created an awesome mural which was inspired by a book called "Maybe Something Beautiful." The children learned about the artist, what a mural is and that as a community they can create something beyond their wildest dreams!



- Some of our students spent November in rehearsals for professional theatre productions in the area. A few performed as ballerinas in the Macomb Ballet Company's five performances of *The Nutcracker* and one is appearing as Martha Cratchit in Oakland University's performance of *A Christmas Carol*. The seventh graders had the opportunity to see their classmate when they attended a performance at Oakland University. The students have been reading a Christmas Carol in literature class.

Service to Others

- Our Brownie Girl Scout troops bought items for, assembled, and delivered gift baskets to elderly residents through OPC in Rochester. The girls were greeted with smiles and happy tears. One recipient stated, "you will never know what a true blessing this is for us! Thank you."
- Students from our National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) served dinner to homeless residents at MCREST the night before Thanksgiving. Residents were so grateful to have a group of smiling faces to spend the evening with them. Many residents shared life lessons and advice with our students. This experience changed hearts as our students learned not to pity homeless people but to recognize their dignity as human beings. They also recognized how we can all use a helping hand and to look for Jesus in these experiences.
- Our teachers provide service outside of the classroom as well. Mrs. Diane Hofsess helped pack trucks with donated Christmas presents at the Oakland County International Airport. The airport's Operation Good Cheer program sends 20,000 gifts to 7,000 children in foster care throughout Michigan.

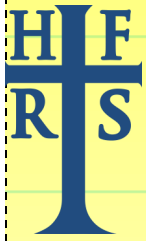

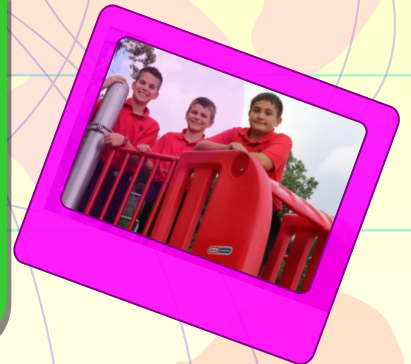
