Love/Charity is our Virtue for April

How appropriate that we focus on this virtue as we emphasize the love Jesus has for us, as we reflect on Him dying for us and in celebration of his glorious resurrection. Love/Charity is another theological gift given to us at Baptism allowing us to love like God does. Living as a charitable person means we love God above all things (and above everyone else) we also love our neighbors as ourselves.

The Gift of the Holy Spirit, wisdom, gives us the ability to see God's plan for the world. With this gift we can see God in all his creations, have delight in spiritual things, judge things according to eternal wisdom, set priorities effectively and focus on what truly matters. We are also able to make time for daily prayers and live a sacramental life.

If we live a life of charity, we will live as St. Teresa of Calcutta. She said, *"Not all of us can do great things, but all of us can do some small things, with great love."*

She understood our Church's Works of Mercy...the corporal works (or the physical things we can do) are:

Give food to those who are hungry, give clothes to the poor, give drink to those who are thirsty, give shelter to the homeless, visit the sick (even through cards), visit the imprisoned (again even through letters and cards), bury the dead (have dignity for those who have died and care for their body).

There are spiritual ways too... they are:


Teach those who need to learn, tell those who don't believe in God what He has done for you, forgive others, be patient with all things, warn those who are doing wrong to change their ways, comfort and give hope to those who are sad, pray for all people alive and those who have died.

April, Month of the Holy Eucharist




