Dear Parents,

In the Gospel this weekend, we hear an account from the life of Jesus before his Passion. Jesus wanted his disciples to know that even though he would not be with them in bodily form, he wasn't really leaving them alone. He would be with them through the Holy Spirit living inside them. He would be with them in the Eucharist. He would be present in their brothers and sisters in the faith. They needed to learn to see him differently.

Like the disciples, we experience change in our lives— change that makes us wonder about God's plans. We need to remember that Jesus does not leave us alone during these times. He wants to give us eyes to see him in every situation. We need to know that Jesus is always present with us and that we can trust our Lord.

On Wednesday, May 10, we will host Grandparent Day at both North and South Campus. A few weeks ago, grandparents were invited by email if their email address was in the FACTS system. Please be sure to pass this information along, if they did not receive the invitation.

The day begins at 8:30am at the North Campus where the students and grandparents will meet in the classrooms for activities. The grandparents and students will then attend Mass at 10:00am. Please note: this Mass is limited to only grandparents, students and teachers. There is a 9:00am parish Mass. Therefore, grandparents should go to the school first and walk over to the church with the children at 9:45am. The church will not be available before 9:45am.

Grandparent Day festivities at South Campus begin at 11:30am. Students will have lunch with their grandparents and spend time in the classrooms. Grandparents are also invited to participate in the May Crowning Ceremony and rosary after lunch. Grandparent day will conclude at the end of the rosary.

In the next couple of weeks, our classroom teachers will be meeting to create class lists for next year. There are multiple considerations used to develop these lists including academic needs, social dynamics, balanced abilities, and class size. Our teachers spend a great deal of time and prayer completing these lists, discerning appropriate placements based on student needs and teaching styles. This is a reminder that we do not take teacher requests. We have an extremely talented group of teachers with diverse teaching styles. Be assured that every teacher shares a common desire to bring out the very best in children, challenging them to reach their fullest potential.

Who is Mother Mary to you?

As you know the month of May is dedicated to our Mother Mary. We celebrate her by crowning her *Queen of Heaven* and *Queen of our Hearts*. Here are a few things you may or may not know about our Blessed Mother.

We observe her *Immaculate Conception*, December 8th which is the day that Mary was conceived inside of her mother St. Anne. St. Anne and her husband Joachim gave birth to a precious baby girl without sin. God needed a pure, sinless, vessel in which to enter the world. Mary was born without sin on September 8th ... as we know she would become the mother of Jesus Christ...the *Mother of God*. We refer to her as Mother of God because Jesus *is* God. Jesus is both human and divine. Some people get confused with this, thinking Mary then created God...not so. We know the Father and the Holy Spirit created Jesus. You may remember several years ago we celebrated Mary's birthday by Enthroning our

The next event in Mary's life is called the *Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary.* This feast day is based on the acts of Mary's parents, Anne, and Joachim. St. Anne and Joachim, at first, were unable to have children but when they were blessed with their daughter Mary they offered her to God when she was a very young girl. They brought Mary to the Temple to consecrate her to God's service at the age of three.

school to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the

Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Did you know that the patron saint of our Detroit Archdiocese is St. Anne (mother of Mary and Jesus' Grandmother)?

The next big event in Mary's life happened to her when she was only around fourteen years old. At this young age while she was praying when the Angel Gabriel appeared to her and said, "Hail favored one, the Lord is with you. Do not be afraid Mary. You have found favor with God. Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son. And you shall name Him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. Our church celebrates this special day on March 25th and is called *The Annunciation* or the "announcement."

Pondering Mary's life, God formed her without sin, she was born, her parents took her to church for a dedication to God and then about eleven years later God sent a message to her that He wants her to be the mother to His son Jesus Christ. Mary said yes!



May is Mental Health Awareness Month

There are many practical tips available to us when we start a physical exercise routine for mental health and wellness. Initially, getting started is a challenging step, but taking that very first step can be rewarding. Listed below are a few strategies to make exercise an essential part of our daily exercise routine.

- 1. Choose an activity that you enjoy: Do your best not to think about exercise as something you must do. In other words, do not think of exercise as a chore. Instead, think of exercise as another tool to utilize on your wellness journey to feeling and looking good.
- 2. Set realistic goals for yourself: Going too far with exercise can have a negative impact on your mental health, especially if you set goals for yourself that you cannot realistically meet. You want to establish a few small goals that you can build upon as you develop mentally and physically during your exercise journey. Always be cognizant that you do not have anything to prove. You are not in competition with anyone else. You just want to be your best self.
- 3. Reward yourself for your effort: No matter how big or small your effort is you should reward yourself. Rewarding yourself for completing a workout is a great way to make it a long-lasting habit. It does not have to be anything big. Something as small as watching an extra episode of your favorite show will be sufficient.


