A Parent's Guide to STAR Assessments – The Role of Progress Monitoring, January, 2024

The middle of year (MOY) Star Assessments have been completed by HFRS students. Depending on a student's grade level, assessment scores will reflect learning progress in the subject areas of early literacy, reading, and math.

What is done with data received from student Star Assessments?

Teachers and administrators are members of Professional Learning Communities for the students, grade(s), subject(s), and campuses they represent. Using multiple Star Assessment Reports, teachers are analyzing recently completed MOY student assessment data to compare and plot individual, class, and grade level growth that has taken place from the beginning of year (BOY) assessments. This analysis of growth and proficiency is referred to as Progress Monitoring. The process is on-going and will be facilitated again as students complete the end of year (EOY) Star Assessments.

What is the value of Progress Monitoring?

Analyzing Star assessment results through multiple reports enables administrators and teachers to monitor student growth, to realize the value of instructional practices, and determine the best course of action to ensure all HFRS students are mastering grade level standards. In addition to Star assessments, teachers in Support Service PLC's can provide math and literacy skill assessment opportunities so that data gleaned can endorse student eligibility for educational services.

What is the value of monitoring student progress on a daily basis?

Different from the process of Progress Monitoring when analyzing Star assessment data, all teachers consistently monitor the progress of their students. On a daily basis teachers look for evidence of student understanding during instruction. Teachers observe and evaluate students as they work. They listen as students ask and answer questions and they look for evidence of homework completion and understanding. Monitoring student progress can be informal, such as scanning the room to see who is on task and who is not, or it can be formal, such as examining quiz, project, and test scores.

The Progress Monitoring of Star Assessment data and the daily monitoring of student progress provides a comprehensive and valuable picture of student growth, student need, and direction for curriculum planning.

Why is it important we take standardized assessments like Star?

It is important to have a variety of progress monitoring tools like Star so that we ensure we're collecting a wide range of results to support our students. This allows us to find trends within the data and adjust our instruction and support appropriately. Similarly, teachers review homework and assessments in class to determine how they instruct moving forward. Star is another assessment tool that guides our instruction.

Empowering God's Children

Dear Parents,

The Catholic Church teaches that God has created each of us as unique and special. *Genesis* 1:27 tells us that we are "created male and female in God's image" and that God saw this as "very good." In that goodness we are meant to respect ourselves and everyone else as persons created and loved by God.

God intends our relationships with one another to be experiences of divine love. A respectful, nurturing, and loving relationship increases our understanding of our own values and helps us love others. It is important to help children understand how special they are and how their relationships with others are sacred. Understanding this will help them protect the special person they are as well as be respectful to others.

We will be introducing our *safe environment program* called *Empowering God's Children* in the next couple weeks. This program comes to us from our Archdiocese and is the child portion of *Protecting God's Children*. It is endorsed by the U.S. Bishops and *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*. It is a supplement integrated into our school's curriculum. It will provide our children with essential knowledge and skills grounded in the richness of our faith to stay safe and healthy. Our teachers will assist children in understanding that we all have holy bodies and the space around our bodies is sacred.

Many protective programs focus only on stranger danger. *Empowering God's Children* goes beyond just protection by helping children understand the holiness of who they are and how to seek help through their relationships with trusted adults.
