Dear Parents,

Last Friday our staff attended the FIRE Conference, and we were blessed to hear from Fr. Mike Schmitz and celebrate Holy Mass with our new Archbishop. We were also honored to see the first class relic from Carlo Acutis. During his first presentation, Fr. Schmitz offered many inspiring words, his reference to each of us in Catholic education as Missionaries was perfect. He also had an important analogy for us to reflect on our purpose at Catholic Schools. He shared that even if you have the best shoe factory in the world- best facility, best products to use, greatest staff, if you are not making shoes...Then you are a failure. As a Catholic School, if we are not creating disciples...Then we are a failure. The word failure is a difficult word to accept. We don't ever want to think of ourselves in this light. However, to have staff from all 79 Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese hear this message was impactful. We have been called, on mission, to be disciples to each other, and to make disciples of our students. We are humbled to have been chosen for these roles, confident in our faith, and willing to accept this challenge. Imagine the world when all our students are living examples of Jesus' love, mercy, grace, and feel confident in their faith to call themselves disciples. This gives us HOPE! As Fr. Mike advised us, "Never let Evil pass your lips. We are the hands and feet of Christ. Here to build His kingdom." We are called to model this behavior to our children at all times.

Earlier this week, the new leadership plan was delivered to the community. I am humbled to be taking on my new role as Head of School, and I look forward to the many opportunities we have ahead as a community working together to honor the Kingdom of God. Most people don't know the 'story' of how I came to Catholic Education. I wanted to take this time to share it.

In August 2001, I went for an interview, because I wanted to become a kindergarten teacher. I had previously been in sales, and it was time for a change to a calling I have had since high school. This was the first day I met Mr. Jon Myers. I was dressed for an interview, and he was in shorts and a t-shirt. The school didn't have any air conditioning, and he was waiting for the police to arrive to complete a report on a broken window/ vandalism to the school. The interview went well, but he called the next day to inform me he had chosen someone else. I was disappointed, and continued to pursue other schools. A week later, he called to offer me a position as an 8th grade teacher. I was nervous and unsure; he assured me that I was a middle school teacher at heart. He couldn't have been more right! For the last 25 years, he has been my mentor, teacher, confidant, and friend. I don't think either of us knew the path God had ahead for us. I am humbled to continue his legacy, his great work, and will continue to ask for his guidance in the years ahead. I wanted to publicly thank him for believing in me so many years ago, constantly challenging me to become stronger in my vocation and my faith. I will miss our daily laughs, reminding each other to stay focused on the mission, but I will be grateful to know he is only a call away when I need his advice.

This Sunday, we begin the journey with our Lord, remembering each step of his journey throughout the week. I pray you take the time to thoroughly embrace this Holy liturgical season so you can celebrate Easter Sunday with the HOPE our Lord gives to us. May each of us use Holy Week as an opportunity to center ourselves with Christ, being Christ-like to one another.

A NOTE FROM MRS. MYERS:

While we prepare for next week...please know this is the holiest week in our faith. Please take time to engage your family in your parish's Holy Week services.

The following link will take you to our USCCB to explain the Triduum, which lies before us. This is considered one complete time, from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. It takes us through *Jesus' Paschal Mystery*, his passion, death, burial and resurrection. Easter Triduum USCCB

Please take time to attend and participate in your parish's Holy week services. Here are a few things to talk about with your children:

- We arrive at Holy week beginning with Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem for the observance of the Passover with his disciples. We celebrate this on Sunday "Palm Sunday." People waved palms as they did when Kings enter the city. They were realizing who Jesus was.
 - o The colors in the church will be red
 - We will hear the complete readings of the Passion
- Thursday, April 17th is Holy Thursday or also referred to as *Maundy* Thursday. "Maundy" is the Latin word which refers to "commandment." Jesus gave his disciples the commandment of "Love one another as I have loved you." This special day also commemorates Jesus' Last Supper and is reenacted at Mass in the evening with foot washing and observing how Jesus instituted the Holy Eucharist, Holy Communion. The evening ends with us remembering Jesus departing to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is observed until Good Friday.
 - The feet washing is different in every parish. Some have twelve people sit up near the Altar and have their feet washed by their Pastor. Some have people scattered throughout the church and the Pastor walks to those chosen who have suffered in the year and receive this prayerful gesture. Others invite parishioners to wash each other's feet.
 - At an early morning *Chrism* Mass at our Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament the Holy Oils used in Sacramental anointing will be blessed by our new Archbishop Edward Weisenberger
 - Catechumens who seek membership in the Catholic Church and who have been preparing for Baptism, Confirmation and First Holy Communion through the *Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults* (OCIA) will have three representatives present the Holy Oils during the procession of the Gifts

- The oils are for Baptism, for the Sick, and Confirmation (as well as Ordination to the Priesthood)
- Help your child understand the significance of this special evening
- o The colors in the church will be purple
- Good Friday is the observance and memorial of Jesus' sacrificial death through crucifixion on the cross at Golgotha.
 - Many Churches Walk the Stations of the Cross and then have an afternoon Memorial service
 - Priests begin this solemn service by laying prostrate in front of the Altar.
 - An opportunity to venerate (kiss or touch) a wooden cross at the Altar is most common
 - The colors of the church will once again be red symbolizing the blood of Jesus
 - This is a day of fasting, which means we may eat one full meal (but smaller than normal) and two smaller snacks (that together do not equal a regular meal).
 - o This is a day we abstain from meat
 - While you may receive Holy Communion, you will notice there will not be the ceremony of the "Breaking of the Bread," we will not witness the consecration.
 We receive the body of Christ from the Holy Thursday Mass and you will receive at the end of the service.
- Easter Vigil ~ If you have never attended your parish's Easter Vigil on Saturday evening you are missing a beautiful Mass...here are some things that happen:
 - o The church begins in darkness symbolizing our world without Christ
 - A bonfire (Easter fire) is lit outside of the church and the new Paschal/Easter candle is blessed and lit.
 - o A Deacon carries the new Easter candle into the church
 - He will stop three times to chant the acclamation "Light of Christ," and we respond "Thanks be to God"
 - The church begins to light up when each parishioner, who holds a small candle, receives the light and spreads it people to people...signifying Christ as the light of the World
 - We hear seven readings from the Old Testament, we sing the Gloria, and the ALLELUIA prior to the Gospel of the Resurrection!
 - Adults will be Baptized, Confirmed, and finally welcomed to the Table of the Lord and brought into Holy Communion with all believers, angels and saints.
 - The color in church will be white and maybe even gold and the sweet smell of spring flowers are heavenly

Easter Sunday

Trumpets will play, joy will fill the air, and all will proclaim *Christ is Risen Alleluia, Alleluia!* Understanding our beliefs, practices and Traditions and realizing the divinity of Christ and the holiness of these several days is a Gift. Pray, Experience and Share! May God bless you and your family with Easter joy!
