A NOTE FROM MRS. MYERS:

One of our wise 8th graders recently asked his mother, "If you were back in Jesus' time would you have believed?"

I've pondered this question myself many times. Many of us will say, of course, I'm a believer. However, that's how many of us were raised, in faith filled and religious families speaking often of who Jesus is and what He did for us.

If we lived in Jesus' time and were steeped in the Law of Moses and followers of the High Priests and Elders and obedient to what these leaders were saying and teaching...would we recognize the truth in what Jesus said and did. Would we recognize Jesus as the promised Messiah and King?

Our most profound prayer should always be that our eyes, our ears, and our heart be open to the truth. We live in a world filled with messages and stories...we can barely escape information through all the devices we rely on to keep us informed. If we allow ourselves to fall into the wrong messages and the wrong way of thinking, we will not recognize the truth...in anything... especially about the saving love of our Lord Jesus Christ.

We also live in a world that is all about us...our needs, our desires, our wants...and when we try to fill these with anything but Jesus we will have greater needs, desires, and wants that will never get met. Once we surrender ourselves fully to Jesus, we will start to see less of what we need, and see what others need...and we will begin to be more like Jesus.

As we enter the Triduum this evening, I pray that you, with each member of your family, ask what you truly believe. Would you have been a believer if you were back on the streets with Jesus or would you have been so steeped in tradition, and the law, that you would not recognize the law in its truest form. Sacred scripture is the Word of God. It is one book, one history from our one God which is here to guide us, but it must be read with an open heart and with the guidance of the Holy Spirit to see and know the truth.

Recently, in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium, after hearing Mrs. Palero and Mrs. Gomez speak of the good news of Jesus, one of our youngest children very passionately and strongly proclaimed, "AND THIS IS REAL!"

From our youngest to oldest children, we hear wisdom and passion. Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not prevent them; for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Mathew 19:14 May our Lord shine upon you as we enter this sacred time of sorrow with Jesus' Passion and Death and ending with everlasting joy in His Glorious Resurrection.






