As we reflect on the past academic year, it is with gratitude and humility that I share our achievements and progress at Holy Family Regional School. Our commitment to fostering a nurturing and enriching environment for our students remains steadfast, guided by our faith and dedication to excellence in education.

Reviewing the Data

During the 2019-2020 school year, we began using Star Renaissance testing along with other Catholic schools across the archdiocese. This is an adaptive test, which responds to each student's unique learning progress. We have closely monitored math and reading academic progress during grade-level Professional Learning

Community (PLC) meetings. While both math and reading scores are above archdiocesan benchmarks, we have implemented new strategies to continue to increase academic learning for all students at our school.

This past year, our school has invested time and resources in professional development to assist teachers in implementing instructional strategies that include classroom differentiation, as well as providing staffing for specialized instructional interventions. We believe this additional support and structure will impact student outcomes, providing long-term success. I am unbelievably proud of our teachers and staff for embracing this change and we look forward to monitoring academic growth in the future.

Professional Development

Investing in our educators' growth is paramount to ensuring our students receive the highest quality education. This year, our faculty participated in a variety of professional development opportunities aimed at enhancing instructional strategies and embracing innovative teaching methods. Workshops and seminars on differentiated instruction, technology integration, and faith-based education have equipped our teachers with the tools they need to meet the diverse needs of our students. These opportunities not only enhance our teachers' skills but also inspire them to bring fresh perspectives and creative solutions into the classroom. I am grateful for their commitment to Catholic education and especially to HFRS.

Interventions

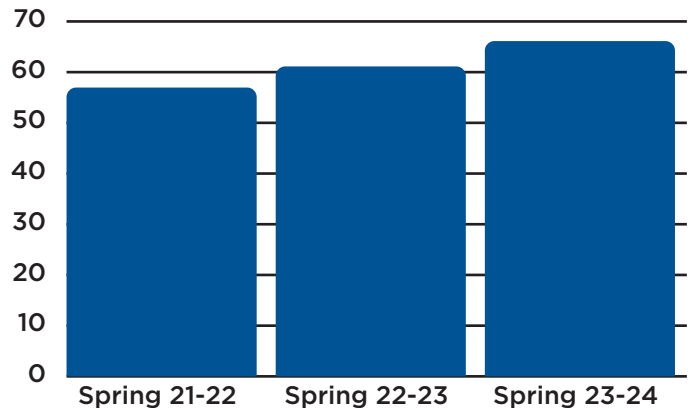

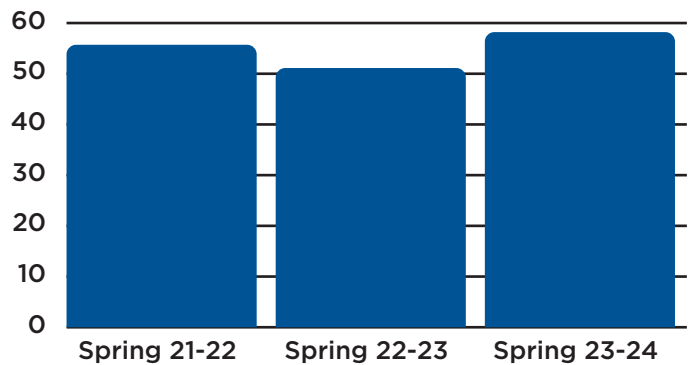

Students in Kindergarten through Fifth Grade visit the Atrium each week as part of the *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS)* ministry. The Atrium is a dedicated holy space filled with materials where our children work independently and intentionally in the younger grades and cooperatively and contemplatively in the older grades. The children encounter Jesus as they hear, read sacred scripture, and work with materials that lead to understanding prayer and our Holy Mass. We continue to add a grade level each year and are blessed that more of our children are privileged to participate in this ministry. The materials and works offered in CGS are based on the child's developmental readiness.

We are also grateful to attend Holy Mass each week at both campuses, take part in Eucharistic Adoration, experience prayer throughout the day in all subjects, and learn what it is to be a disciple of Christ and a Catholic Christian.

FIVE-YEAR STRATEGIC PLAN

The HFRS Strategic Planning Team used the four domains identified by the National Catholic Standards and Benchmarks as the framework for the school strategic plan. Goals have been developed in the areas of Mission and Catholic Identity, Governance and Leadership, Academic Excellence, and Operational Vitality.

YEAR TWO PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Mission and Catholic Identity

Domain 1

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Students in grade four began to receive instruction in Level III Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. An Atrium was established at the South Campus and dedicated teachers received training for the program.

Domestic Church

Parents received education and formation in understanding their role in the Domestic Church. Lessons and materials were distributed in the weekly newsletter and a video series was released during the season of Advent.

Service Opportunities for Families

Students and parents participated in service projects with follow-up opportunities for prayer and reflection. The students are understanding their role in being the hands and feet of Jesus Christ.



School Incorporation

The school administration took all steps necessary to bring the school to full incorporation. As an incorporated entity the school is positioned to secure its assets, protect the brand, and independently grow the school's financial position.

Board of Directors

As part of the school incorporation, a governing board was established to provide strategic guidance for the successful operation of the school. The newly formed board has a diverse background with representation from each of the Family of Parishes.

President-Principal Model

Administrative leadership responsibilities have been divided to support the growing demands of sustaining Catholic education. The school president oversees the implementation of the strategic plan, and the principal oversees the daily operations.



Academic Excellence

Domain 3

Professional Development

Additional days were added to the calendar for teachers to spend dedicated time in Professional Learning Communities (PLCs). Teachers used computer adaptive assessments to monitor academic growth and adjust instruction to track progress.

Differentiated Instruction

New instructional strategies were used to engage students in learning at different levels. By offering a range of instruction and assessments, students were able to foster a deeper understanding of the material.

Social and Emotional Wellness

Students learned skills in self-awareness, decision-making, social mindfulness, and relationship building. Skills were presented in the context of a Catholic framework rooted in moral and virtuous living.



Operational Vitality

Domain 4

Staff Retention

Financial resources were allocated to compensate teachers with a retention bonus. A formalized plan is in progress to strengthen and improve teacher recruitment, salaries, benefits, and bonuses.

Enhancing School Safety

A comprehensive security assessment of all school buildings was completed, and full-time security guards were added to both North and South Campus.

Alumni Engagement

Class representatives have been identified for each graduating class and several alumni events took place throughout the school year. A quarterly alumni newsletter was distributed, and an alumni database is in progress.

Athletics

During the 2023-2024 school year, our athletic program experienced an exceptionally successful season. At Holy Family Regional School, our athletic teams had memorable seasons marked by joy and a strong sense of accomplishment. The fall season was particularly notable, featuring a historic achievement with our teams winning the CYO Football Prep Bowl Championships in both the A-B and C-D Divisions. This milestone had never been reached before in the long history of Detroit CYO within the Archdiocese of Detroit. Our celebration at Ford Field in downtown Detroit truly embodied the spirit of Holy Family Regional School.

In addition, our cheer, volleyball, soccer, and cross-country teams also had outstanding seasons, promising a bright future for our student-athletes. The winter season saw HFRS field 15 competitive basketball teams across both boys' and girls' divisions, culminating in 3 division championships. Our top two boys' basketball teams advanced significantly into the postseason, while our bowling team also secured several division championships and achieved a 3rd place finish at the CYO Bowling Championships.

Spring brought further success with our varsity lacrosse team securing their second consecutive league championship, maintaining an unbeaten streak of two years—a remarkable feat. Our track team continued to excel, with the girls' team finishing second at the CYO League Championship meet and the boys' team finishing fourth.

Overall, HFRS remains vibrant and robust. We have revitalized our Athletic Advisory Council (AAC), which will collaborate closely with school administration to support our athletes. Over recent years, we have significantly invested in our student-athletes, updating uniforms for nearly all sports and enhancing our football equipment with new shoulder pads and helmets. Additionally, we have upgraded our volleyball net system to a state-of-the-art model.

Holy Family remains one of the largest CYO athletic programs in Michigan and the Midwest, having fielded over 55 teams and more than 400 student-athletes last year. We take immense pride in our student-athletes and coaches, with our all-volunteer coaching staff of over 200 parents and friends working tirelessly to support our athletic endeavors. We are deeply grateful to all our families for their contributions, which have made HFRS Athletics what it is today. God bless, and it's a great day to be a Wildcat!

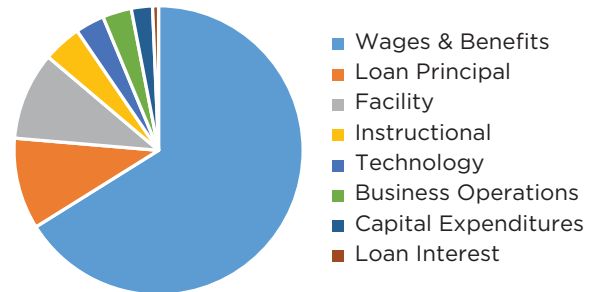
